

Pastor's Message

MONTH OF THE LAST THINGS

November is the month of Last Things, namely, death, judgment, Heaven, and Hell. During the month of November we pray for those who have died. Praying for our deceased family members and friends is a work of mercy and an act of love. As Catholics, we know this instinctively. When someone dies, we arrange for a Mass to be said for them. When we go to church we hear the names of the dead announced in the Mass intentions. If you would like to have someone prayed for throughout the month of November, then please write their name in the Book of Remembrance on the stand at the entrance of the church (Saturday 5:00pm and Sunday 9:00am) or at the entrance to the school gym (Sunday 11:00am). We pray for the dead because we believe that our prayers can help them through purgatory on their way to Heaven. At every Mass celebrated in the parish throughout November, those listed in our Book of Remembrance will be remembered in the intercessions. The good news for all of us, saints and sinners alike, is that purgatory is the last step in the process of our sanctification as we journey to Heaven, where we will worship God with the communion of saints, looking forward to the Resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come.

November is also a good month to think about your funeral arrangements. Ordinarily, the funeral rites include the Vigil at the funeral home, the funeral Mass in the Church, and the Committal at the graveside. If cremation is to take place, it is preferable that the funeral Mass be celebrated with the body. Thus, the Mass will begin with the introductory rites, which means greeting the body at the doors of the church and covering the casket with the white funeral pall as a symbol of baptism, for having died with Christ in baptism we have the promise of being raised with him in the Resurrection. Likewise, the Mass will conclude with the rites of farewell, which means sprinkling the casket with holy water, again a symbol of baptism, and the incensing of the body, honouring it as a temple of the Holy Spirit and symbolizing that our prayers for the deceased are rising to heaven. The beauty of these rites speaks of our hope in the future glory of the resurrection of the dead. If cremation takes place beforehand, the funeral Mass can be celebrated with the ashes present in the church, but without a body, the rites of farewell are not performed. The funeral Mass is offered for the deceased, but it takes place in the usual fashion. When cremation follows the Mass, the Committal of ashes takes place at a later date. Sometimes people who could not attend the funeral Mass are able to attend the Committal. I would also like to mention that Catholics bury the ashes of their dead, or entomb them in a niche or columbarium. We do not scatter ashes. Scattering signifies that life is futile and death is final. It contradicts our hope that life is changed not ended. We also **don't keep ashes in our homes. The burial or entombment of ashes symbolizes our belief that the dead have passed from this life into eternal life.** Holding onto the ashes contradicts our hope that the dead go to Heaven. It also prolongs the grieving process. The funeral home will keep the urn until burial arrangements have been made and will deliver it to the place of Committal.



I would like to take this opportunity to thank the St. Peter's Cemetery Board for their good work and, in particular, to thank Fred Hawkins for overseeing the installation of a beautiful new front gate (see photo). Finally, I would like to leave you with these beautiful and hope-filled words from St. Paul's First Letter to the Thessalonians: "We do not want you to be uninformed, brothers and sisters, about those who have died, so that you may not grieve as others do who have no hope. For since we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so, through Jesus, God will bring with him those who have died." (1 Thessalonians 4.13)
