



Pastor's Message

CANADA 150

In order to mark the 150th Anniversary of Confederation, Bishop Crosby and the bishops across Canada are consecrating the country to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The Prayer of Consecration will be prayed at every Sunday Mass offered in every parish in our Diocese during the Canada Day weekend. Special cards have been published by the CCCB in order that parishioners may participate in the final two paragraphs of the prayer. The adult catechetical resource prepared by the CCCB and available from their Web site (cccb.ca) explains that the consecration is a "renewal of our first consecration at Baptism" but



"in the particular form of a personal pledge." Noting that the Blessed Mother shines forth "in the community of believers as the perfect example, icon, and model of what it means to live by faith," the resource affirms that "in imploring Our Lady's help ... we welcome with joy and enthusiasm the joys of discipleship in the work of the New Evangelization." As well as showing how consecration to Mary is linked with the teachings of the Second Vatican Council, the adult catechetical resource also mentions the examples of recent Popes who consecrated or entrusted the Church to Mary, while noting the importance of devotion to Mary in the history of the Church in Canada as well as universally. Beginning with the early Jesuit missionaries who consecrated their missions to Mary Immaculate, a number of Canadian dioceses, eparchies, parishes, schools, cities and buildings have been named in her honour. The first time the country as a whole was consecrated to the Blessed Mother took place in 1947 during the National Marian Congress which was held in Ottawa.

As you may have noticed, however, that some people are protesting this year's Canada Day celebrations, and perhaps with good reason. Our history isn't all as sweet as maple syrup. In recent years we have become more aware of the tragedy of the residential schools. Likewise, many immigrants faced discrimination when they came to Canada. In my own family, my Ukrainian grandfather, in order to receive a job promotion, was forced to Anglicize our surname. (That's right, I'm not of English descent.) Nevertheless, our history need not be as unsavoury as a salted beavertail. (My apologies if you prefer your beavertails flavoured with salt rather than syrup or sugar.) I believe that consecrating our country to the Immaculate Heart of Mary is a fitting way for us as Catholics to mark this important milestone while acknowledging our failings and our need of Mary's help to become the country we aspire to be. The prayer of consecration addresses issues such as religious freedom, abortion, assisted suicide, the needs of the poor, and care for creation, upholding Indigenous Peoples as the first stewards of our land. If we are going to achieve, not simply to aspire to our Canadian ideals, we won't be able to do it all by ourselves. Our country needs the help of God. This is something secularized Canadians won't appreciate until we share our Catholic faith with them. God keep our land glorious and free. Happy Canada Day!
