



# Pastor's Message

## SACRED HEART AND ST. PETER'S: ONE CATHOLIC CHURCH

When I became your pastor almost two years ago, I committed myself to serving both Sacred Heart Parish Church in Rockwood and St. Peter's Mission Church in Oustic. While respecting the terms of Bishop Crosby's 2012 Decree of Separation, I also committed myself to promoting cooperation between the two faith communities. The more time I spent in each faith community, the more I became aware of their differences, but I also became convinced that working together would be mutually beneficial. At that time, I emphasized the fact that each faith community had the same pastor. It followed that, while each faith community was financially independent, fraternally they formed one parish. As I liked to say, we were one parish with two churches. Liturgically, this was reflected in the way we celebrated the Easter Triduum, with the Mass of the Lord's Supper and Good Friday at St. Peter's and the Easter Vigil at Sacred Heart. Pastorally, this was reflected in the way parishioners from both faith communities band together in times of funerals. Socially, this was reflected in the way the Knights from both faith communities hosted the Coulson Cup and the way the members of the CWL from both faith communities hosted the Turkey Supper. Ultimately, my hope was that we would work together to build up the kingdom of God here on Earth.

A year ago, when the Bishop asked me to add Sunday Mass to my responsibilities in order to serve the students at the University of Guelph, I had to make changes to the parish Mass schedule. After consulting with the Bishop, it was decided that the Saturday evening Mass in Rockwood would be cancelled and that the Mass at St. Peter's would take its place in the parish. In the beginning, it was good. After the first Saturday evening Mass at St. Peter's, we held a dinner on the grounds that was well attended by parishioners from both faith communities. Although some St. Peter's parishioners were unable to accommodate the change, the Mass there was well attended throughout the summer. However, something happened in September. By and large, the parishioners from Sacred Heart who started attending the Saturday evening Mass at St. Peter's just stopped coming. Likewise, there was a decline in the number of St. Peter's parishioners attending Mass there. To this day, I don't know what happened. I realize that a large number of parishioners from both faith communities started attending other parishes in the area. But I don't know why. All I know is that the compromises were no longer working for either faith community.

In January I met with Bishop Crosby. We discussed the need for a new church in Rockwood and the need for a Mass on Sunday in Oustic. At that time, he approved a feasibility study for a new church for Rockwood on the hill at the entrance to Camp Brebeuf. He also said he would provide a Mass on Sunday for St. Peter's. Last week we learned that St. Peter's will be transferred to St. John Brebeuf Parish in Erin on June 28<sup>th</sup>, 2017. Although we will no longer be one parish with two churches, we will continue to be members of one Catholic Church. I'm confident that working together will continue to be mutually beneficial for both faith communities. We will continue to welcome each other into our churches. We will continue to come together for the Coulson Cup and the Turkey Supper. We will continue to volunteer together for Adoration, a ministry we already share with parishes in Fergus, Guelph and Acton. After so many years of close collaboration, there is sadness in parting. Yet, as we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus Christ, let us be hopeful that God will bring about new life through these changes. For example, perhaps parishioners from Erin will now join us in our Adoration ministry. During this Easter Season, let us pray that our two faith communities will continue to work together as one Catholic Church building up the kingdom of God here on Earth.

Don plans to celebrate Mass at St. Peter's on Sunday, rather than the current Vigil Mass on Saturday evening. Fr. Don is a native of Guelph. He is coming from St. Mark's Parish in Kitchener. I know him well from my time as a pastor in Kitchener. Our parishes bordered each other. I look forward to working with him again. I'm sure he will serve St. Peter's very well.
